Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental Disabilities (LEND): Provides training to graduate and professional students to serve children and youth with disabilities and the families that care for them. Mentoring with Oversight for Developing Independence with Foster Youth (MODIFY):

Paths for Parents: A parent mentor project that works in collaboration with the West Virginia Children with Special Health Care Needs program. A registered dietician assesses and coordinates the nutrition care for children. Parent Network Specialists provide peer-to-peer support and advocacy coaching to parents and caregivers. Positive Behavior Support (PBS): Trains a statewide workforce, serving persons with intellectual/developmental disabilities, traumatic brain injury and co-existing disorders on skills needed to decrease challenging behaviors and improve quality of life. Specialized Family Care (SFC): Recruits and trains host families to provide training, nurturing and a family living environment (aka foster care home) for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities who need full-time care. Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) Services: Provides services and supports to persons with a traumatic brain injury through information and resource referral. Offers training and technical assistance to other agencies to enhance service capacity and knowledge in the field of TBI.

Feeding & Swallowing Clinic:

Provides interdisciplinary assessments and recommendations for children from birth to 21 years of age who have feeding problems. Improves eating skills and behaviors, physical growth and development and the nutritional status of children.

Intensive Autism Service Delivery (iASD) Clinic:

Provides one-to-one behavioral services to children, ages 2 to 6 years, who have been diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder. Treatment is based on the science of applied behavior analysis, combining discrete trial training with naturalistic and incidental teaching and applied verbal behavior.
